MassMutual's responsible contractor policy highlights



- 1. Over \$2.8 billion spent on union labor from 2006 to present.
- 2. Established Responsible Contractor Policy.
- 3. Periodic Policy review meetings with the North America's Building Trades Unions.
- 4. Proactive notification to North America's Building Trades Unions of any subcontracted work on our equity projects expected to exceed \$250,000, so that they can identify union contractors to bid on the work.
- Periodic meeting with MassMutual real estate managers to review current and future projects.
- 6. Lending language that encourages borrowers to seek bids from union contractors.

"In 2013, MassMutual commenced significant infrastructure renovations and capital improvements to both its Springfield and Enfield Headquarters' campuses.
